Travel to Finland and to the Nordics compared to previous year and pre-pandemic

Border survey latest 12 months (Oct 2023 – Sep 2024)

- Foreign visitors made **4.7 million trips** to Finland during the **latest 12 months**, and they **spent 3.7 billion euros in Finland**. **Median length of stay** was **4 nights** and **73%** of the visitors were travelling for **leisure purposes**.
 - Estonia, Sweden, Germany, and UK were the biggest source markets by the number of trips made to Finland.
 - Germany, Estonia, USA, UK, and France are biggest contributors in total spending in Finland.
 - Visitors from Austria and Estonia have the best carbon efficiency rate (€/CO2).

Registered overnights in Finland Jan-Sep 2024

- Number of <u>registered</u> foreign overnights in Jan-Sep 2024 were 9% above the figures of previous year, but 14% below pre-pandemic. The biggest source markets were Germany, Sweden, USA, France, UK, and the Netherlands.
 - 45% of the foreign overnights took place in the Helsinki region and nearly 30% in Lapland region. There was a positive development in overnights in each region except Lakeland compared to previous year, but only Lapland region has surpassed the level of Jan-Sep 2019.
- In **September 2024**, registered foreign overnights **decreased slightly** compared to previous year and *remained 23% lower than in Sep 2019*.
 - Nearly half of the overnights were spent in Helsinki.
 - Lapland region surpassed clearly the level of overnights in Sep 2019.

Short-term rentals in Finland year 2023 and H1-2024

- In 2023, foreign overnights in short-term rentals was 2.1 million, so the total number of foreign paid overnights added up to 7.8 million.
- The share of foreign overnights in short-term rentals was already 26% in 2023, and during the first half of 2024 it was 28%.



Summary

Travel to Finland and to the Nordics compared to previous year and pre-pandemic

Registered overnights in the Nordics Jan-Sep 2024

- Total number of registered foreign overnights during Jan-Sep 2024 was over 45 million, which was 7% more than same period last year and also 7% more than in 2019.
 - Finland's share of foreign overnights has decreased from 13% in Jan-Sep/2019 to 10% in Jan-Sep/2024.
- In September 2024, foreign overnights were highest in Denmark (1.3M; YoY +12%, vs. 2019 +37%), Sweden (1.2M; +11%, +12%), and Norway (0.8M; +17%, +25%). Iceland and Finland had smaller volumes (0.5M and 0.4M respectively), and in both countries the number of foreign overnights remained below both Sep/2023 and Sep/2019 figures.

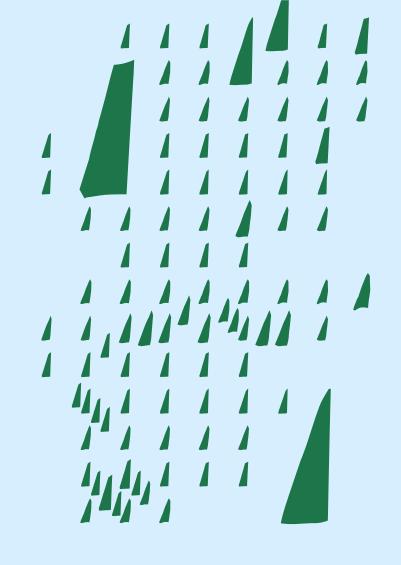
Flight capacity and bookings for the winter season

- Flight **capacity** for the winter season is improving to **Finland** and **Norway** compared to previous winter and the capacity is *also* very close to the level of winter 2019. Current situation with the **bookings** shows even **stronger growth** than the growth with the flight capacity for **Finland** and **Norway**.
 - In Sweden, the capacity remains at the same level than last winter. Bookings are above the level of last year and pre-pandemic, but they are not growing as strongly as to Finland and Norway.
- **Seat capacity to Finland** is **improving** both compared to previous winter and winter pre-pandemic from **Europe** and **USA**. Capacity from **Asia is still 30% below pre-pandemic level**.
- **Bookings to Finland** are **increasing** from several source markets compared to both previous year and pre-pandemic. Flight reservations for the winter season are highest from **Germany**, **UK**, **France**, **USA**, and **Switzerland**.

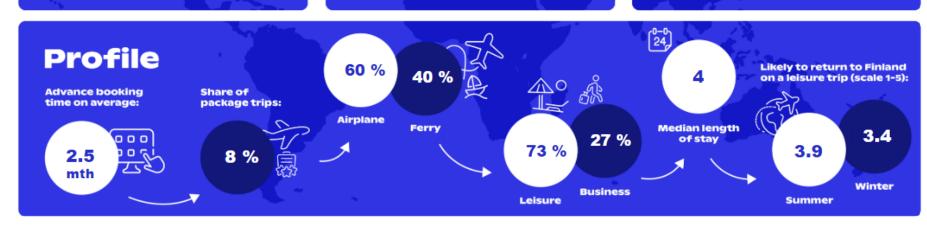

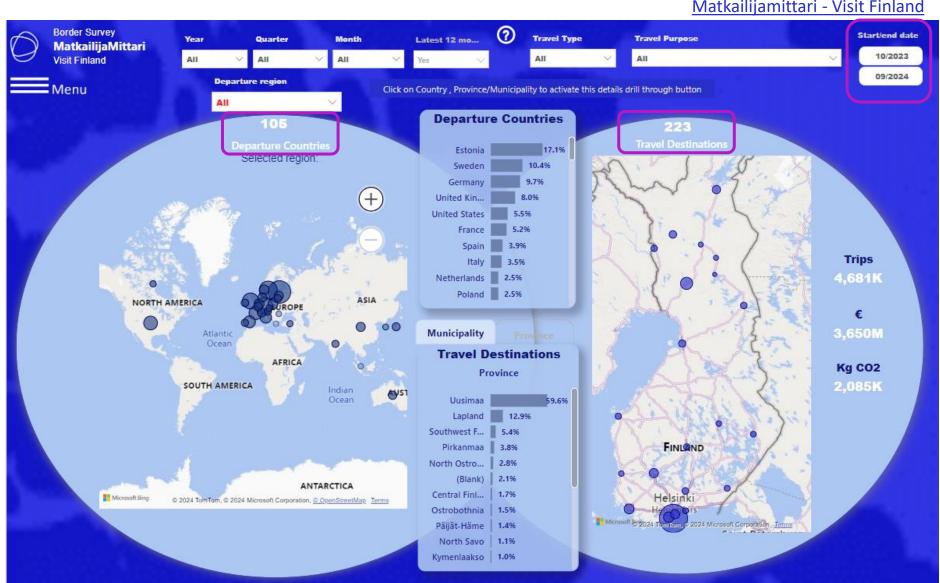

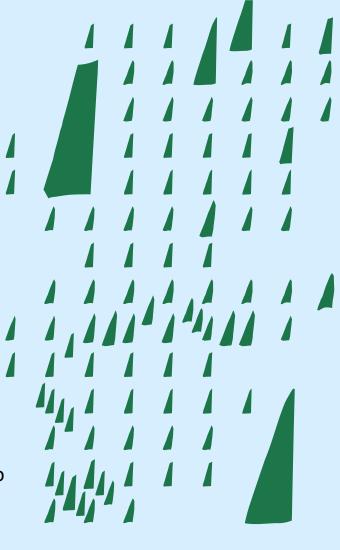
Registered overnights

January – September 2024

- Foreign overnights increased by 9% compared to previous year but remained 14% below the level of 2019. The biggest source markets were Germany, Sweden, USA, France, UK, and the Netherlands.
- Total accommodation revenue remained at the same level as last year. Foreign revenue increased by 13%, but domestic revenue decreased by 5%.

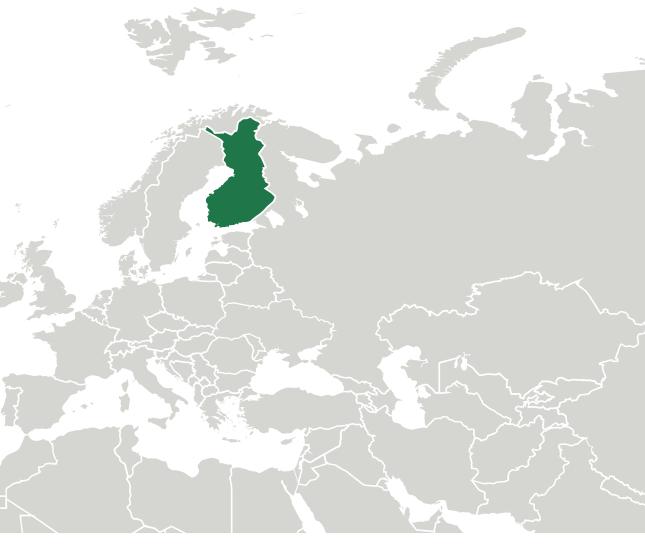
- Foreign overnights: 400,100 (-3% vs. 09/2023 & -23% vs. 09/2019)
- Top source markets: Germany, Sweden, USA
 - Among the top10 source markets, overnights increased in September both compared to previous year as well as to 2019 from **Germany**, **USA**, **Spain**, and **Switzerland**
- Main destinations: Helsinki, Vantaa, Rovaniemi
 - Among the main destinations, foreign overnights increased in September both compared to previous year as well as to 2019 in **Rovaniemi**, **Inari-Saariselkä**, and **Oulu**.

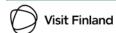

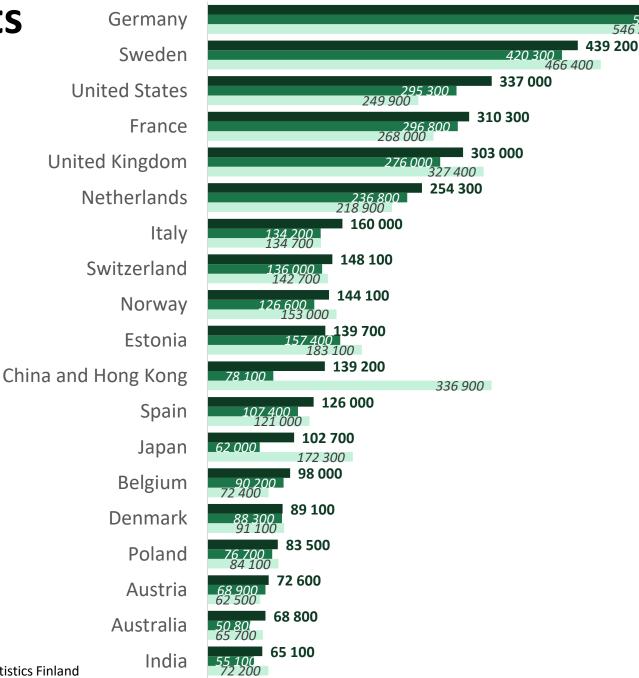

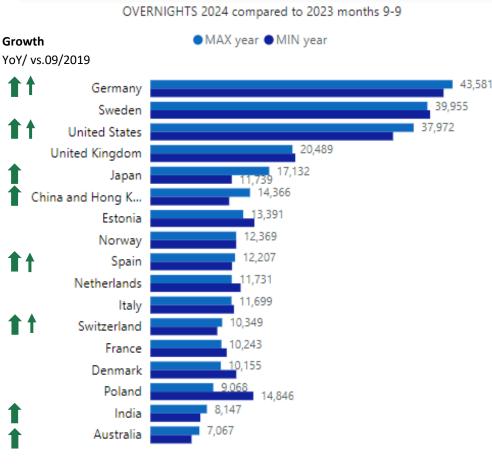

Overnights in short-term rentals

- The importance of **short-term rentals via international platforms** has clearly increased during the latest years.
- In **2023**, **foreign overnights** in short-term rentals added up to **2.1 million**, so the total number of **foreign paid overnights** was **7.8 million**.
- The share of foreign overnights in short-term rentals was already 26% in 2023, and during the first half of 2024 it was 28%.
 - Number of foreign overnights in short-term rentals are following the same pattern than registered overnights – biggest increases are in winter months.
 - Rovaniemi has the biggest share of short-term rentals from the total foreign paid overnights. Last year it was already nearly 40% with a year-on-year growth rate as high as 74%.





Foreign overnights in short-term rentals

(Airbnb, Booking.com, Tripadvisor, and Expedia Group)

- Number of foreign overnights in short-term rentals exceeded the 2019 level already in 2023.
- The first half of this year shows that the use of short-term rentals keeps growing strongly especially during the winter season.



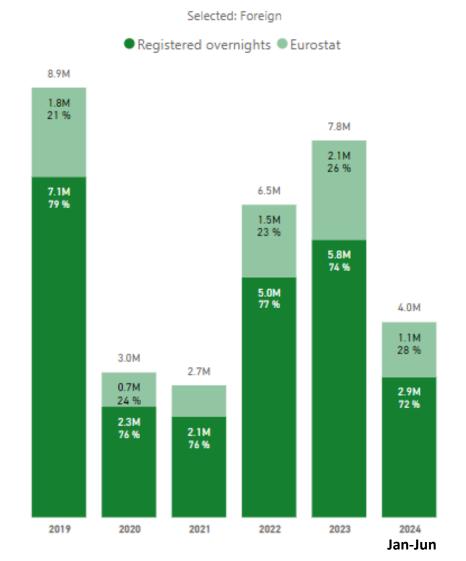


Foreign total paid overnights in Finland

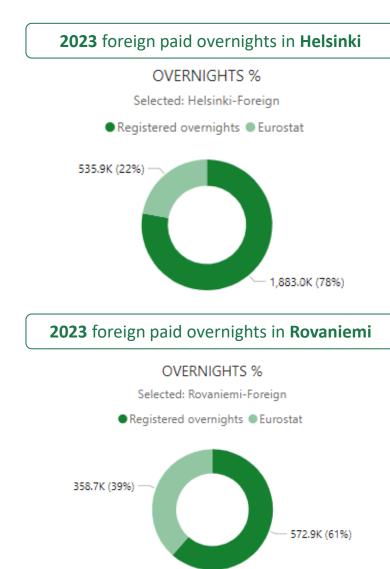
(Registered overnights + overnights in short-term rentals)

The share of short-term rentals is growing, and **last year** it was already **26%** of the foreign total paid overnights in Finland. During the **first half of this year**, the share of short-term rentals was **28%**.

Helsinki and Rovaniemi were clearly the most popular destinations by the number of foreign paid overnights. Last year, the share of foreign overnights in short-term rentals in Rovaniemi was already nearly 40% and in Helsinki 22% of the total paid overnights.

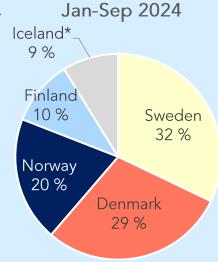

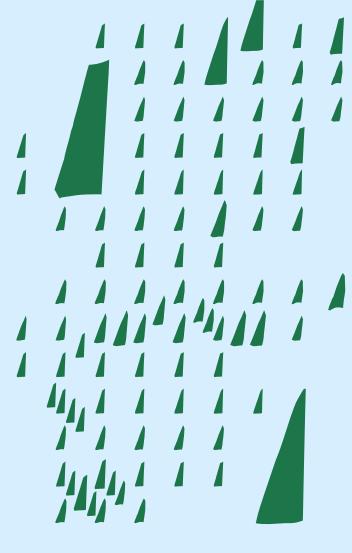
• **Total number** of foreign overnights was over **45 million**, which was **7% more** than the same period last year and also **7% more** than in **2019**.

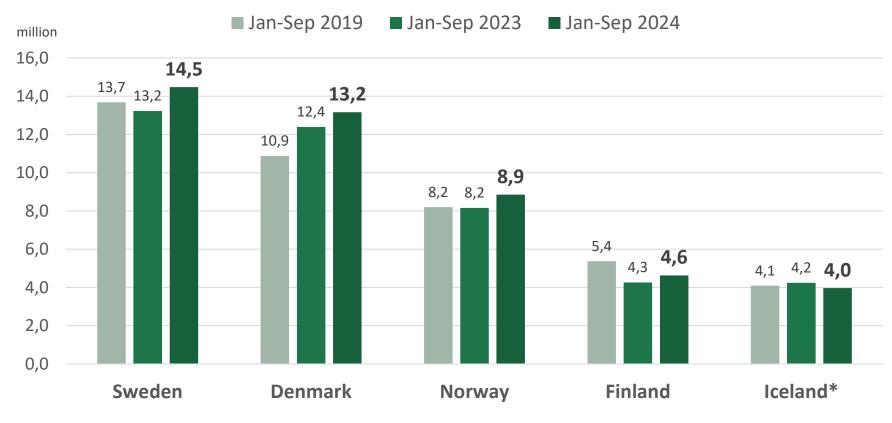

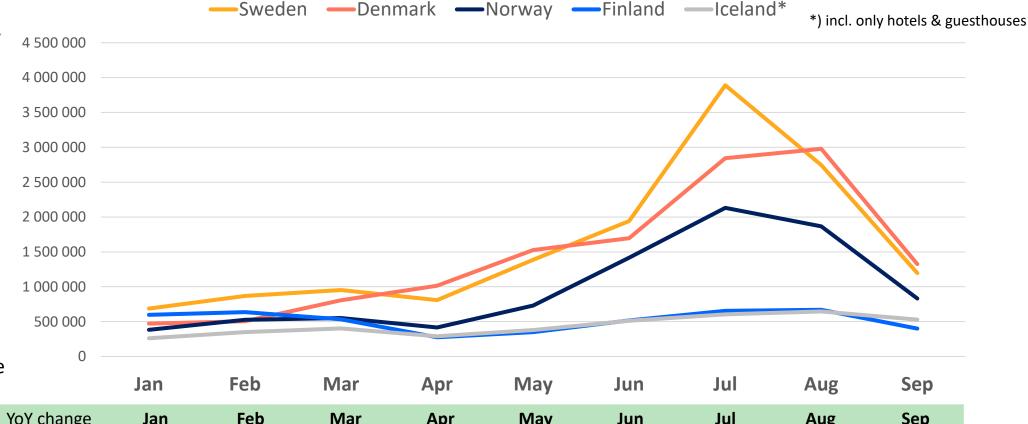
Registered foreign overnights in Nordics Jan-Sep 2024

Iceland reached 2019 levels during several months in 2023, but this year foreign overnights were above 2019 only in May.



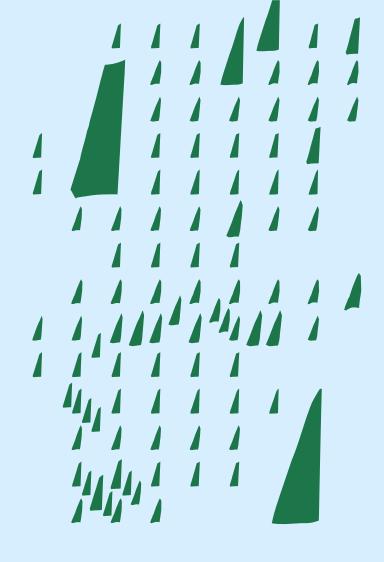

Flight capacity and bookings for winter

Outlook for Dec 2024 – Feb 2025

- For the winter season, capacity is improving to Finland and Norway compared to previous winter. It has also nearly reached the pre-pandemic levels in Finland and Norway.
 - Capacity to Sweden remains on the same level than last winter, so it still stays 19% below pre-pandemic level.
- Demand for winter travel to the Nordics can clearly be seen in flight bookings which grow strongly compared to both previous winter and the winter before the covid years.
 - Bookings made by the 10th of November shows that **Finland** is leading the way with nearly 190,000 bookings.
 - Winter bookings to Finland, Norway, and Sweden are growing from several markets both compared to previous winter and to winter pre-pandemic.





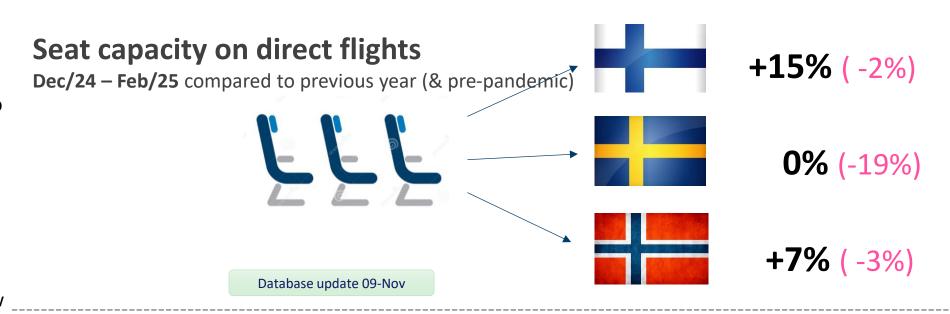
Seat capacity & flight bookings worldwide for Dec/2024 - Feb/2025

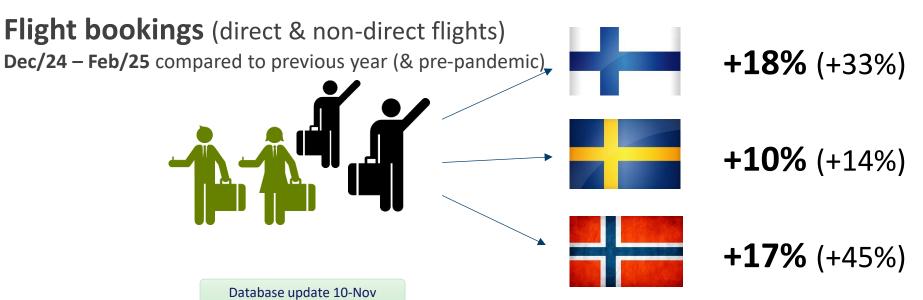
Seat capacity for winter months is increasing to Finland compared to previous winter, and it is also getting closer to the prepandemic level compared to other seasons.

Bookings of foreign visitors for winter have increased strongly both for Finland and Norway, so it seems that new records will be made this winter again in both countries. Bookings to Sweden show positive development as well.

It looks also that bookings are made earlier than before, so the pace of the growth seems to slow down towards the winter months.

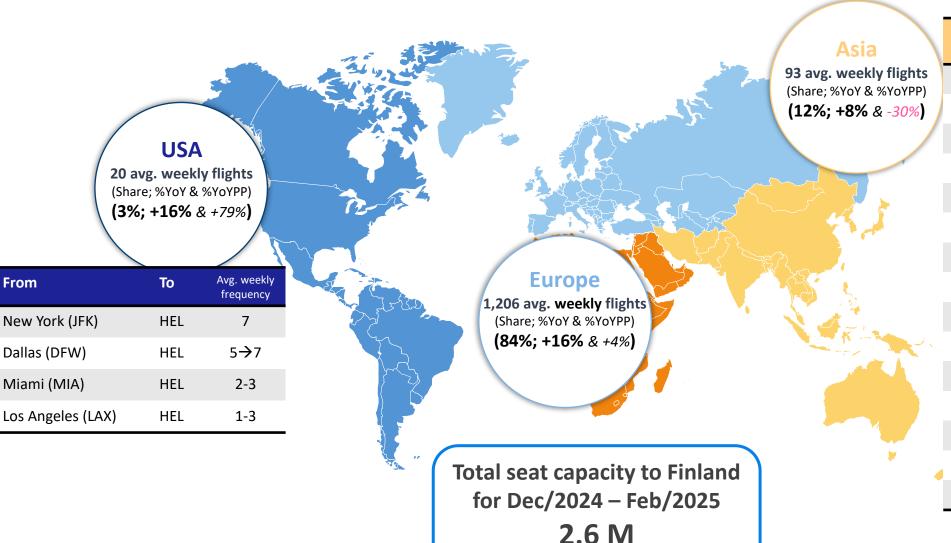






Direct int'l flights to Finland Dec/2024 – Feb/2025
